



**Resolution #2026-02**

**A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING TRIBAL & TDHE CONSENSUS-BUILDING FOR NATIONAL INDIAN HOUSING LEGISLATIVE ISSUES**

**WHEREAS**, the National American Indian Housing Council represents the housing interests of American Indian tribes, Alaska Native villages, and Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) and Tribally designated housing entities providing housing services to approximately 431 Tribes, Alaska Natives, and Native Hawaiians; and

**WHEREAS**, the stated purpose of the organization is to promote advocacy for policy and legislative changes that will favorably impact on our primary goals of providing culturally relevant and quality affordable housing for Native people in a manner recognizing the unique government-to-government relationship of tribes and the federal government; and


**WHEREAS**, the United States Congress recognized the need for housing assistance and economic development in Indian Country when it passed the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 (NAHASDA) as amended.


**WHEREAS**, NAIHC works with the House and the Senate to propose bills for the modernization and re-authorization of the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA) as needed.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the National American Indian Housing Council does hereby support the principle that all TDHEs, Tribes, and the HUD TIAC Committee should engage in consensus-building for national legislative issues, including early and frequent engagement of all regional housing organizations and the Legislative Committee and full Board of the National American Indian Housing Council.
